
Meeting Minutes

Special Call Meeting – Revised 5/12/2026

Meeting Date: May 4, 2026
Green Level Municipal Building

Governing Body Members Present: Mayor Hosea McBroom, Mayor Pro Tem Patricia Jones, Councilmember Remonia Enoch, Councilmember Stephanie Enoch, Councilmember Sandra McCollum

Green Level Officials Present: Town Administrator Brandon Enoch, Town Clerk Taylor Elizondo & Town Attorney Eugene Russell.

Mayor McBroom called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM.

Roll Call: Town Clerk, Taylor Elizondo, conducted a roll call of the Town Council. All council members were present.

Invocation: Mayor Pro Tem Jones

Approval of Agenda: Mayor Pro Tem Jones made a motion to approve the agenda for the May 4, 2026, Special Call Meeting. Councilmember McCollum seconded the motion.

Mayor Pro Tem Jones & Councilmember McCollum voted in favor of the motion. Mayor McBroom, Councilmember R. Enoch & Councilmember S. Enoch voted against. The motion failed (2-3).

Mayor McBroom gave Mayor Pro Tem Jones the floor. She stated the motion was to approve the drafted agenda. Mr. Russell stated there was a question on how the Council would decide to continue the meeting. Councilmember S. Enoch stated she voted against the motion to approve the agenda as she had questions about who the personnel were to be discussed. Mrs. Elizondo stated that Mayor Pro Tem Jones sent a request to call a special meeting to discuss personnel and meeting conduct. Councilmember S. Enoch stated that she understood personnel to be the staff, and inquired if council members would be considered as personnel. Mr. Russell stated the second purpose of the meeting was to discuss meeting conduct. Mrs. Elizondo stated that a revised notice for the meeting went out a few minutes after the first via email, and the printed copy delivered to all council members stated the meeting was called to discuss personnel and meeting

conduct. She apologized for the error in the first notice that was emailed. Mr. Russell stated that as Mayor Pro Tem had called the meeting, she could provide further explanation. Mayor Pro Tem Jones stated that she called the meeting to allow a resident to speak to the council.

Councilmember R. Enoch inquired about the procedure if the agenda is not approved. Mr. Russell stated that the majority of the council would decide how to proceed, whether to continue with the meeting or not. Mayor Pro Tem Jones stated the question is if the council can proceed with the meeting if the agenda is not approved. Mr. Russell stated that the council could agree to set an agenda and use the opportunity to hear about the issue or move to adjourn.

Councilmember R. Enoch made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mayor McBroom seconded the motion.

Mayor McBroom & Councilmember R. Enoch voted in favor of the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Jones, Councilmember McCollum & Councilmember S. Enoch voted against. The motion failed (2-3).

Councilmember S. Enoch stated that she would like to get this issue straightened out. She inquired about what Mr. Russell recommend the council do. Mr. Russell stated there is an opportunity for the council to discuss the issue but stated he was unsure if there would be any progress or ability to avoid something coming up again. Mr. Russell stated the majority must agree on what is to be discussed. Councilmember S. Enoch stated that the council should do something to clear the issue up. Mr. Russell stated the council could agree to continue the meeting, and he had provided a memo about the code of ethics and the process for addressing conduct. He stated that the process outlined in the code of ethics required a majority vote to go forward with any formal investigation. Councilmember S. Enoch inquired if the council members involved in the matter would vote on any action to move forward. Mr. Russell stated no and summarized the process from the code of ethics that was adopted. Mr. Russell stated the process outlined within the code of ethics is for accusations to be made in a formal way, otherwise any issues could be resolved among the members. Mayor McBroom stated that the council decides what they wish to do. He stated the council needed to decide if they were to hear comments from a citizen that were heard at the previous meeting. Mayor Pro Tem Jones stated that a resident reached out to her with a request to come and address the council. She expressed concerns about what could happen and how the situation would continue to grow if the council did not address the concerns. Mr. Russell stated that it is up to the council, but there should be the consideration of following procedure. Councilmember R. Enoch stated that residents are

allowed to address the council during public comment at every regular Town Council meeting. Councilmember R. Enoch stated that as three individuals were named in the allegation, only two council members could vote on the matter. Mayor Pro Tem Jones stated that the resident should be heard without the three-minute limit of public comments. Mayor McBroom stated the council should not be concerned with threats of a resident coming back to speak, and a decision should be made one way or the other. Councilmember S. Enoch inquired if the resident could speak directly to Mayor McBroom to address any concerns. Mayor McBroom stated that as he had been personally attacked, he was not required to communicate with the resident. Mrs. Elizondo read the record for the two motions made during the meeting. Mr. Russell stated the council could have a motion to approve or set an agenda, allowing the resident to speak as Mayor Pro Tem Jones had requested. Councilmember R. Enoch inquired if there was another option. Mr. Russell stated that the council could vote to adjourn. Councilmember S. Enoch inquired what Mr. Russell recommend, as the council's representation. Mr. Russell stated that there is a risk of letting someone speak and present what may be considered evidence without going through the formal procedure. Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

Mayor McBroom, Councilmember S. Enoch & Councilmember R. Enoch voted in favor of the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Jones & Councilmember McCollum voted against. The motion passed (3-2)

Mayor McBroom adjourned until 7:00 PM on Thursday, May 14, 2026.
