
Meeting Minutes

Governing Body Members Present: Mayor Pro Tem Patricia Jones, Councilmember Remonia Enoch, Councilmember Stephanie Enoch, Councilmember Sandra McCollum

Green Level Officials Present: Town Clerk Taylor Elizondo & Town Attorney Eugene Russell.

Mayor Pro Tem Jones called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

Roll Call: Town Clerk, Taylor Elizondo, conducted a roll call of the Town Council. Mayor Hosea McBroom was not present

Approval of Agenda: Mrs. Elizondo stated that Parks & Recreation Manager, Christian Miles, was present and requested to be added to the agenda, after the public hearing. Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to approve the agenda, with an amendment to add Mr. Miles after IV. Public Hearing. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Public Hearing – Proposed 6-Month Moratorium Extension: Mrs. Elizondo presented Ordinance 2026.09.02, to extend a moratorium on any development approval required by law in the Town of Green Level for a period of six months. Mayor Pro Tem Jones opened the public comment section for the hearing. There was one comment. Faye Pinnix stated that she was in favor of the ordinance and inquired if there would be public notice in a newspaper if it is passed. Mrs. Elizondo stated that if adopted by the Council, the ordinance would be uploaded to the Town's website. Ms. Pinnix inquired if the scheduled outlined in the ordinance factored in the winter months, or if winter weather could cause delays to the projects. Mr. Russell stated that a schedule was required by statute, but the moratorium could be extended if there were significant delays. Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to close the public hearing for the proposed 6-month moratorium extension. Councilmember McCollum seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2026.09.02, extending a moratorium on any development approval required by law in the Town of Green Level for a period of six months. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Parks & Recreation Request: Mr. Miles stated that the Green Level Trojans hosted their first home game of the 2026 season the previous weekend. He stated that the current league, AYF, is different than the previous season and had more strict requirements. Mr. Miles requested the Council allow the department to move the remaining home games of the 2026 season to the football field at Cummings High School. Mr. Miles stated that the Municipal Park had limited parking, even with the new lot and additional field space. He stated the current lots held about 96 parking spots, which was not sufficient to accommodate players, coaches, spectators and the opposing teams. Mr. Miles stated the hired security expressed concerns for public safety with the limited space, with over 600 people in the Municipal Park during the last game. Mr. Miles reported that after the last home game, he was informed that the field was not regulation size. He stated that representatives from the league were present and would be present at the next home game to ensure all regulations were followed. Mr. Miles stated that if the field was not regulation size, the Trojans would have to forfeit their games. He provided some alternatives to expand the field but stated that none of these solutions could be done in time for the next game, scheduled September 12, 2026. Mr. Miles stated that he had conversations with representatives from Cummings High School and Eastern Alamance, who both would allow the Trojans to host their home games on their football field. Mr. Miles stated that Cummings High School would allow the Town to operate part of their concession stand, and keep all monies collected.

Councilmember R. Enoch stated that while the preference is to keep the Trojans at the Municipal Park, the Town would have to do what it needed to ensure the teams could still play the season.

Councilmember McCollum inquired why the size of the field was an issue this year. Mr. Miles stated that while the American Youth Football League provided better competition, the requirements were stricter as some of the teams had children who are in middle school.

Councilmember McCollum stated that the teams should not have changed to the new league without preparing for the changes. Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to move the remaining youth football home games from the Municipal Park to Cummings High School.

Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

The motion failed (2-2). Councilmember R. Enoch & Councilmember S. Enoch voted in favor of the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Jones & Councilmember McCollum voted against the motion.

Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to go into closed session in accordance with NC G.S. 33C. 143-318.11 (a6) to discuss personnel. Mayor Pro Tem Jones seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Closed Session

Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to resume the open session. Mayor Pro Tem Jones seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Open Session Resumes

Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to approve the employment contract for Stevie Cox, for the Town Administrator position. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

Councilmember McCollum stated that there were conditions in the contract that she did not agree with and requested this concern be noted on record.

The motion passed (3-1). Councilmember McCollum voted against the motion.

Mayor McBroom joined the meeting at 6:15 PM.

Mr. Miles repeated his request to move the Trojan home games from the Municipal Park to Cummings High School for the remainder of the 2026 season. Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to allow the Parks & Recreation Department to move the remaining youth football home games for the season from the Municipal Park to Cummings High School. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

The motion passed (3-2). Mayor McBroom, Councilmember R. Enoch & Councilmember S. Enoch voted in favor of the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Jones & Councilmember McCollum voted against the motion.

Councilmember S. Enoch made a motion to adjourn until the September 10, 2026, regular meeting. Councilmember R. Enoch seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

Mayor McBroom adjourned until 7:00 PM on Thursday, September 10, 2026.
